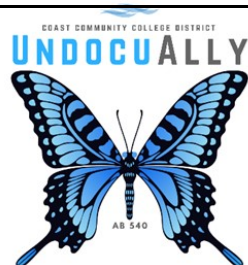


What is the difference between CA Dream Act & DACA?



CA Dream Act (<i>college financial aid</i>)	DACA (<i>Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals</i>)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allows students to apply for and receive state financial aid • CA State law • Must meet qualifications and apply at www.caldreamact.org (application is FREE) • State Aid: (<i>qualifications vary</i>) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CA College Promise Grant (tuition fee waiver), Cal Grants, Chafee Grant, Institutional grants • Private scholarships for public colleges and Universities 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allows temporary relief from removal and obtain work permit (if granted) • Executive order, not law • Must meet qualifications and apply with USCIS, www.uscis.gov (must pay fee to USCIS) • Does not equate to permanent legal status • <u>UPDATE: visit USCIS website, www.uscis.gov, for more recent changes</u> • <i>DACA's rescindment is currently being challenged in courts. As of August 2018 people who currently have or previously had DACA may apply to renew</i>
