**CSU FULLERTON:** BA in English. AA-T accepted in English – general option.

**CSU LONG BEACH:** All majors at this campus are impacted. Please see counselor for admission and selection criteria for this major. Local Admission: Minimum 2.0 GPA required and completion of major preparation coursework above for admission.

Options available in Creative Writing, English Education, Literature, Rhetoric and Composition, and Special Emphasis. AA-T accepted in American Studies – general, Comparative World Literature – General, Creating Writing, Literature, Rhetoric and Composition, and Special Emphasis areas.

3.1: For all options: Complete either ENGL G110 or ENGL G112.

3.2: Additional requirements for English Education option. For option in English Education, Complete either ENGL G150 or G155; ENGL G270 or G275 AND, one from ENGL G161, THEA G100, or ENGL G114. Option in English Education requires an additional subject emphasis. Please see GWC Counselor for emphasis areas, as well as coursework that may meet these requirements.

3.3: For Rhetoric and Composition, select two courses from: ENGL G150, G155, G270, or G175. For Option in Literature, complete all courses. Required for options in Literature, and option in Rhetoric and Writing.

**UC BERKELEY:** BA in English. Students should complete IGETC or L&S Reading & Composition, Quantitative Reasoning, and Foreign Language requirement prior to transfer.

**UC IRVINE:** BA in English.

5.1: Complete 6 units from ENGL G112, G150, G155, G160, G160H, G161, G161H, G270, G275.

5.2: Proficiency at the sixth quarter/fourth semester of a foreign language required (at GWC, any 285-level course).

5.3: All students must complete a "Humanities Core". Students can select from either HUMAN 1A + 1AS + 1B + 1BS + 1C + 1CS at UCI, or (a) one writing course from ENGL G100/G100H or ENGL G110/G110H, (b) One additional literature course selected from ENGL G112, G150, G155, G160, G160H, G161, G161H, G270, G275 (if not already used in 5.1), (c) one History course from: HIST G120, G150, G161, G162, G170, G175, G180, G185, and (d) One Philosophy course from: PHIL G100, G102, G120, PHIL G150/PSCI G150.

**UCLA:** BA in English

6.1: Complete ENGL G170 and one course from: ENGL G175 or ENGL G150 or ENGL G155

6.2: Foreign language at the 4<sup>th</sup> college semester ( at GWC, any 285-level course) OR Foreign language at the 2<sup>nd</sup> college semester (G185-level course), PLUS two Literature in Translation courses: ENGL G160 + ENGL G161.

\*Transfer students who have satisfied the UCLA Foreign Language requirement at the high school level through IGETC (Area 6) may satisfy the departmental foreign language requirement with 5 foreign literature in translation courses.

**UC RIVERSIDE:** BA in English.

7.1: Complete either ENGL G270 or G275

7.2: Recommended coursework for the major.

7.3: Recommended: One course in either British History or American History, such as HIST G170 or HIST G175. A score of 3, 4, or 5 on the AP US History exam will satisfy HIST 17B at UCR.

**UC SAN DIEGO:** BA in Literature. Ten areas of emphasis areas available: Cultural Studies, Writing, Composite, Russian Literature, Spanish and Latin American Literature, US Latino/a and Latin American Literature, Literatures in English, Literatures in French, Literatures in German, Literatures in Italian, and Literatures of the World. Please visit <http://literature.ucsd.edu/> for additional information on these concentrations.

8.1: The Literature majors at UCSD require a secondary literature requirement. This entails required study in a language other than English and the attainment of that language at the upper-division level, including the study of literature taught in the second language. Students can prepare for this requirement by taking lower-division courses (enough to reach fluency level, usually one to two years) in American Sign Language, French, German, Greek, Hebrew, Italian, Latin, Russian, or Spanish.

8.2: Literature/Cultural Studies requires three lower division course requirements, including LTCS 50 and 52 (taken after transfer at UCSD), and one additional literature course. ENGL G150 or ENGL G155 will meet this additional course requirement.

8.3: Literature/Writing, Literature / Russian Literature, Literature/Spanish and Latin American Literature, Literatures in English/French/German/Italian/World concentrations can use ENGL G150 + G155, and ENGL G270 + G275 to meet some lower division requirements.
