1. ANNOUNCEMENTS

- A. Teacher of the Year Rep. Jennings announced that Jason Sheley, Philosophy, was awarded GWC Teacher of the Year.
- B. Spring 2023 meetings Chair Green reported on the Academic Senate's update on Brown Act committee meetings in spring. Committees can continue COVID emergency remote practices through February 28 when the state of emergency is lifted. In person meetings under Brown Act will resume March 1st. The IPD will meet in LRC 250. IPD members who will not be able to attend in person meetings due to scheduling conflicts were asked to notify Chair Green so the Academic Senate can place a call to fill the vacancy.

- A. Proposed Alternative Methods (AM) project for Recommended List (18) hour modules earn (1) LHE each
 - 1. CCCCO Spring 2023 ACUE Microcredential Courses (Registration Info)
 - a. Inspiring Inquiry and Preparing Lifelong Learns (Online Teaching)
 This 6-module course addresses practices from motivating students to using visualization tools that deepen learning and help students take greater ownership for their own learning.
 - b. Designing Learning Centered and Equitable Courses (Online/Face to Face Teaching) This 6-module course fully supports both instructors who are building a course from the ground up as well as those teaching a predesigned course.
 - c. Inclusive Teaching for Equitable Learning Courses (Online/Face to Face Teaching)
 This 8-week microcredential, Inclusive Teaching for Equitable Learning, provides course
 participants with proven strategies to create a more equitable and just learning environment.
