Refuge Calvary Chapel HB	Refuge Calvary Chapel in Huntington Beach offers hot meals, clothing, groceries, job listings, and transportation assistance every Thursday through its Lunch & Prayer Ministry. Additional food distribution takes place on Mondays and Tuesdays from 2–3 PM. services at Refuge Calvary Chapel include hygiene kits, blankets, ponchos, tarps, lunches, and free California ID and phone assistance. They also offer housing support, informational services via the RefugeLink app, and a Makers Ministry to help individuals earn income through handmade goods.

Saint Bonaventure Catholic Parish - HOPE Office	The HOPE office assists students with food and clothing needs. Students must first go in person to be interviewed and will be allowed a specific number of visits per month.
