NONCREDIT - ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM INFORMATION

Noncredit classes are FREE. There is no unit charge for noncredit classes.

Golden West College's noncredit courses are designed for students who wish to advance their educational and career goals. Noncredit courses are offered on-campus, off-campus, and online. They provide students with lifelong learning, college transfer, and career preparation opportunities. All noncredit courses are FREE, with no proof of residency needed. The classes are highly accessible and repeatable with no prerequisite courses. Most importantly, the courses serve as a critical "open access" entry point for students of diverse backgrounds and those seeking self-improvement, increased literacy, and job skills.

NONCREDIT-ADULT EDUCATION CLASSES

Students can earn special certificates by enrolling in Noncredit - Adult Education Programs.

Noncredit - Adult Education courses are tuition-free. However, students are expected to purchase textbooks and supplies. Students can enroll in multiple classes and can also meet with a counselor to develop a Student Educational Plan.

ENROLLMENT

Students must be 18 and older to enroll in adult education courses.

REGISTRATION

Registration is based on a first-come basis and continues until the classes reach full capacity. Waitlists are started for full classes. The Noncredit - Adult Education Programs department reserves the right to cancel a class if student enrollment falls below the minimum limits.

ATTENDANCE

Attending every class meeting is essential for all students! Student attendance directly impacts how the Noncredit - Adult Education Programs department receives state funding. Students who miss the first day of class may be dropped from the course. Students are expected to attend class on time and stay for the entire session. Persistence and consistent attendance help students achieve their goals.

CITIZENSHIP PREPARATION PROGRAM

The citizenship preparation program is designed to prepare non-native speakers of English to complete the U.S. citizenship process. Preparation includes reinforcing critical points of the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) civics study questions by reviewing basic U.S. history, government, and constitution. Also, students will develop English communicative skills through the practice of interactions and interview techniques to understand and complete the final USCIS interview.

GENERAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT (GED®)

This GED test preparation program prepares students to succeed on the GED exams. Students will prepare for the GED exam in all four areas: Social Studies, Science, Language Arts, and Mathematics. The courses provide pre- and post-testing of each subject content and individualized prescriptive instruction in preparation for the test.

The GED® Test is used in California to award high school equivalency certificates. To schedule the GED® exams, students must register online by visiting www.GED.com or by calling the Pearson VUE call center at 1-877-EXAM-GED (392-6433).

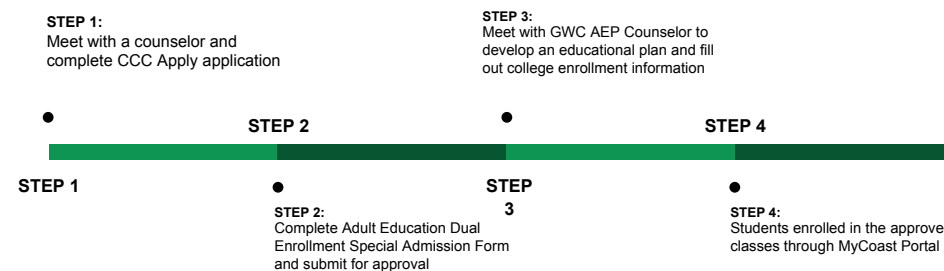
ADULT DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM **NEW!**

AUTOMOTIVE SAFETY

This course covers general safety guidelines for the automotive industry. Students will learn about Personal Protection Equipment (PPE), how to safely use and maintain automotive tools, vehicle hoists, and other equipment used in the industry. In addition, students will take the S/P2 (Safety and Pollution Prevention) safety test which outlines proper procedures for hazardous waste handling and disposal.

Course content includes safety, customer awareness, program administration, equipment maintenance, and inspection and testing procedures for OIS and ASM smog tests. Students who complete and pass this course will have met the Bureau's training requirements to qualify for the Smog Check Inspector state licensing examination.
