Extended Opportunity Programs & Services (EOPS)

This week we will take a look at the Extended Opportunity Programs & Services (EOPS), CARE, and NextUp/Guardian Scholars programs which provide personalized support for students challenged by language, social, economic, and/or educational barriers.

EOPS Support Services Include:

- Academic and career counseling
- Book services
- Chromebook loan
- Calculator (TI-84) loan
- Emergency loans
- Peer advisement
- Personal letters of recommendation
- Priority registration
- Referral services (on campus and off campus)
- Study center/computer lab
- Snack/Hygiene pantry

COOPERATIVE AGENCIES RESOURCES FOR EDUCATION (CARE)

The CARE program is designed to assist single parents who are recipients of CalWORKs/TANF and are EOPS eligible. The CARE staff understands how a single parent who is supporting a family may feel overwhelmed trying to balance the responsibilities of an education and home. We are here to help qualified students balance those responsibilities by offering additional financial assistance and support services.

NEXTUP/GUARDIAN SCHOLARS

The NextUp/Guardian Scholars Program provides a range of services and resources for current and former foster youth/wards

of the court who are interested in pursuing a college education. Our goal is to assist Guardian Scholars students to increase their confidence as educated, self-reliant individuals with the skills to become strong role models and future community leaders.

What is your role at GWC?

I am the CARE Program Specialist. I have worked at Golden West College for five years, in the EOPS/CARE/Guardian Scholars/NextUp Department. CARE (Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education) is a state funded program designed to assist single parents who are recipients of CalWORKs/TANF who are attending college and are EOPS eligible. Students must have at least one child, be single head of household, and be over the age of 18 to qualify for CARE. CARE students are guided and supported to achieve their educational goals. In addition to receiving EOPS services, the CARE Program assists eligible students with educational workshops, support groups, gas cards, unmet need grants, school supply vouchers, counseling services, scholarship opportunities, community resources and referrals.

I love helping our single parents. As I have conversations with

the students, I get new ideas to better serve them. These ideas turn into events, such as the CARE Turkey Drive, Holiday Adopt-a-Family, and "Make a Memory" drive. Also, our students get invited to community events such as the Mother's Day Tea, Christmas Brunch, Halloween Trick-a-Trunk, and others. In addition to being the CARE Specialist, I am the EOPS/CARE/GS Club Advisor, EOPS/CARE/GS Advisory Co-Chair, Region 8 CARE Coordinator Chair, Project Self-Sufficiency Board Member, and a CA Notary Public.

What motivates you to work hard?

My mother is my motivation to work hard. She was a single parent who raised seven children. She did not have any family in the US, did not speak English and worked two jobs. No matter what, she made sure that her family was taken care of and we had a roof over our heads. She motivated me to work hard and do good



by others. Growing up I knew I wanted to work in a place where I could help others they way my mother helped others in need. I love my job. By working in the CARE Program, I can assist the single parents because I understand their needs, and I know how valuable the services and events are to them. *-When you love what you do you never work a day in your life.*

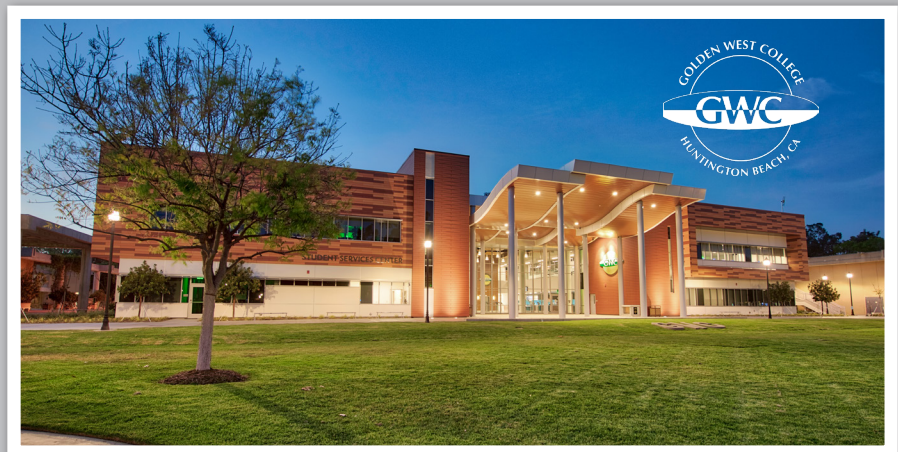
