Fentanyl

Fentanyl is a powerful synthetic opioid that can be deadly, even in small amounts. It is a major contributor to fatal and nonfatal overdoses in California and the United States. As part of our commitment to student health and safety, the Student Health Center (SHC) will be offering free Fentanyl test strips to GWC students starting Spring semester 2024. These test strips can help you identify the presence of fentanyl in drugs, potentially preventing an accidental overdose.
