October: Non-perishable dried goods and canned food items such as pasta, rice, cereal, dried beans, vegetables, meats, and fruits. Donations will be used to stock and supply food pantries for students on the GWC campus.

November: Toys for our EOPS/CARE students on campus. Toys should be new and unwrapped so that they can

be distributed based on age group. Suggestions include board games, action figures and dolls, electronic games, sporting goods, books, and arts/crafts activities.

December: New and gently used blankets, jackets, coats, scarves, hats, towels, gloves, new socks and mittens for the winter. All sizes (children and adults) are welcome. Gently used items should be clean and free of holes/damage. Donations will be given to a local shelter.
