Guest Speakers

Sung W. Lee, M.D., M. Sc., is board-certified in Internal Medicine. He lectures and leads studies on the effects of brain education training for health and well-being. He currently serves as secretary of the International Brain Education Association USA.

Charles Royston III, an anthropological philosopher, teaches Human Services and Anthropology at CSU Fullerton. All aspects of the human condition fascinate him. His life, political activism, belief in service, and the books he writes are fueled by his personal philosophy "One Global Family: Each and every human being sees themselves in the eyes of another; regardless of different background or belief."

Bob Smith, a CSU Professor Emeritus, specializes in strategic management, decision support systems, and systems design. He served as Chairman of the statewide Experts Systems Council, where he was involved in projects focusing on knowledge coordination between many disciplines. He has also taught business, Public Policy, Marine Biology, and English.

Dr. Marco Turk is internationally recognized as an ethnic conflict peacebuilder, educator, and trainer. He is Director of Negotiation, Conflict Resolution, and Peacebuilding Graduate/Undergraduate Programs at California State University Dominguez Hills. He is GWC's first Peace Studies Award recipient.
